Most Americans see higher taxes under the GOP plan Story Highlights Most Americans support higher taxes on the wealthy, more spending on social services Independents are divided on what to do with the budget surplus and budget cuts Republicans are backed by more conservative-leaning Americans WASHINGTON, D.C. -- Americans generally support higher taxes on the wealthy and more spending on social services. They are divided on what to do with the budget surplus, and they are less sure of their views on government budget cuts. A new Pew Research Center survey finds that 58% of Americans favor a tax hike on the wealthy and that, overall, 57% say they would support raising taxes for people who make more than \$250,000 annually. Just 33% are opposed to a tax hike on the wealthy. That includes majority support for the top individual income tax rate, currently 39.6%, being raised to 45% or even 50% on those who make more than \$250,000 annually. Just 9% want the top individual income tax rate to remain at the current level. The share of Americans who want higher taxes on the wealthy has grown since 2010 (from 47%), and the percentage favoring higher taxes on the wealthy is higher among those under age 35 than among those over age 65. Most Americans favor expanding the federal safety net. But independents are almost evenly divided on how to spend the budget surplus and on whether to make budget cuts. Budget Surplus Most Americans see the federal budget surplus as a "good thing," but there are sizable differences across political and demographic lines. For example, 74% of Republicans and Republican leaners favor making budget cuts, but this sentiment is held by only 44% of Democrats and Democratic leaners. Among Republicans and Republican leaners, those under age 35 (60%) are more likely than older adults (48%) to say budget cuts should be made.
